

Combined, they work in the medium of possibilities as they create one-of-a-kind glass sculptures-inspired by their Sonoran Desert locale-for a range of public, commercial, and residential spaces.







Lost wax casting is a versatile method that can be used to duplicate nearly any item as a glass object—that's right, that's right, we said nearly any item.



OUR PROCESS BEGINS

by constructing a rubber mold around an item which we fill with molten wax, which when cooled becomes an exact duplicate of the original item. A plaster/silica mold able to withstand high heat is then created around the wax shape and the wax is then steamed out—or "lost"—from the mold creating a negative of the original item that can now be used to create glass forms.







